STEWARDSHIP SUNDAY

It is a matter of some importance that once a year our worship takes into its system the reality of our Christian Stewardship. The Annual Parochial Church Meeting has been held recently enough for us to have some awareness of our parish finances, and later this year there will be the Quinquennial Inspection of the church building, and although we are not expecting any really nasty shocks we shall certainly find that certain things have to be done. Without pre-empting what is likely to be said in church today, the fact remains that our planned giving is our basic source of income, and it is something which needs to be kept under constant review. This is probably the opportunity for thanking Miriam Massey, our Stewardship Recorder, for all the work she does quietly in the background in connexion with this important aspect of our parish life. She is always ready to hear from anyone who would like to join the Stewardship scheme. Her number is 020 8394 0453. If 'Stewardship Sunday' was being held on an ordinary 'green' Sunday we would doubtless have had suitable hymns and the like to emphasise this side of things, but in Eastertide nothing should really interrupt the uniqueness of the fifty days of resurrection praise, so the hymns and readings remain firmly 'of the Sunday.' However, the sermon-slot and the prayers will enable our Christian Stewardship to be kept firmly before our eyes today.

A reminder that Ascension Day falls this week. Each year this festival, the statement of its substance being considered worthy of inclusion in all the Creeds, remains the Cinderella of the greater Dominical festivals of the Church. I believe - though I am not absolutely certain of this – that English Roman Catholics are now permitted this year, and for the first time, to observe the feast on the following Sunday. In fact it is always difficult to know what is the right thing to do about Ascension Day, but this year we shall do the same as last year by having a simple Sung Eucharist at 12 noon. In this way the Ascension will at least be observed on 'the fortieth day' itself. Being realistic, however, all the signs are that with all the current stress on the unity of the Easter season, and with the fact of Ascension Day always being a mid-week festival, the odds are that the move towards a Sunday observance of the Ascension will sooner or later become an unofficial feature of Anglican practice, and no doubt eventually evolve into an official one. In places like cathedrals, where there is a daily round of highly organized worship, it is easy enough to maintain the celebration of the Ascension on the actual weekday, but it is not so easy in normal parochial life, particularly in a fast-paced urban society.

It is also **Rogation Sunday** today, at least in the Prayer Book scheme of things. The service of Christian Family Praise at 1100 has a Rogationtide feel to it, and it is

entitled *Water of Life.* Time and weather permitting, a short part of the service will take place at the spring, just by the War memorial by the Dog Gate entrance to Bourne Hall. We have, of course, our own temporary 'spring' in church, with the gently bubbling water feature at the Easter Garden.
