Candlemas (or 'The Presentation of Christ in the Temple') 31st January 2010

If this is your first time at St Mary's today, you are very welcome. Please come for coffee in the church hall across the road after the 9.30 service.

Today we celebrate Candlemas. When Jesus was brought as a baby to the Temple in Jerusalem, an old man named Simeon called him 'a light to lighten the Gentiles'. For this reason, the festival is usually associated with light and candles.
