Lent Project Presentation: Alan Anderson, vice-chairman and building co-ordinator for the Lazarus Home for Girls in Bethany will visit the Coffee Morning on 10th March. He will update us on the new building for the girls (2008's Lent Project) and telling us about the Jeel Al Amal Boys' Home in Bethany (this year's Lent Project). The presentation will commence at 11am.

There will be a **children's Easter Fun Day** on Thursday 8th April. The day will involve various craft activities, easter egg painting, etc., with a children's service at the beginning and an Easter egg hunt at the end!
