9.30am SUNG EUCHARIST (Common Worship)

Choral setting of the Eucharist: Viadana – Missa L'hora Passa

We use the pink readings sheet for the first part of the service, then move to the usual Sung Eucharist service booklets.

The choir begins the service with 'Hosanna to the Son' by *Hutchings*.

Hosanna to the Son of David.

Blessed be the King that cometh in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna, thou that sittest in the highest heavens.

Hosanna in excellsis Deo.

After the Palm Gospel, the choir sings 'Pueri Hebraeorum' by Palestrina.
