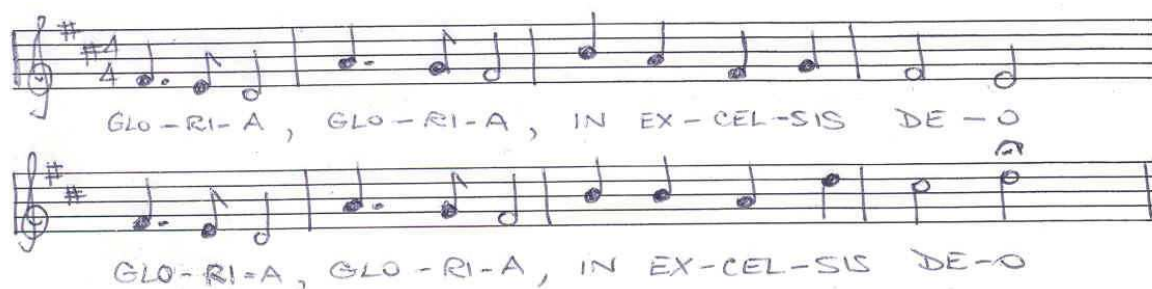

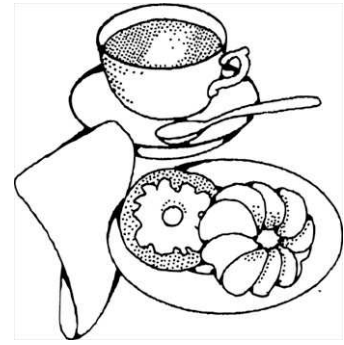
THIS WEEK
