Sunday Prayer Cycle

We pray today for the church and for the world, and especially

in the Anglican Communion, for the provinces of Aotearoa, New Zealand and Polynesia; in our diocese, for the Bishop of Guildford; in our parish, for the Altar Servers; and for all who live in Mill Lane.

Almighty God, give us grace to cast away the works of darkness and to put on the armour of light, now in the time of this mortal life, in which your Son Jesus Christ came to us in great humility; that on the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge the living and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

O Lord our God, make us watchful and keep us faithful as we await the coming of your Son our Lord; that, when he shall appear, he may not find us sleeping in sin but active in his service and joyful in his praise; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

After the Peace, the new purple altar frontal will be blessed. The frontal has been donated by John Richard and made by residents of Manormead in Hindhead who are with us this morning.

O Lord God almighty, who for forty days taught your servant Moses to make ornaments and linen, which Miriam wove and made for the service of the tabernacle of the covenant: bless, sanctify, and consecrate these cloths for the covering and enveloping of the Altar of your most glorious Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

Immediately after the Vicar has said this prayer of blessing, the offertory hymn begins. Meanwhile the high altar is censed. The side altar is also censed to dedicate to God its new wooden mensa and extended kneeling step, made by Ray Eyres.


