Rite of Anointing with prayers for healing

After the sermon, members of the choir, then congregation are invited to come forward for anointing with the oil of the sick at the chancel screen, and/or laying on of hands and prayer in the side chapel. Personal prayer in the side chapel can also be offered for someone absent who is sick.

During the anointing we sing first: **NEH 194, verses 1-2 only**

The choir then sings 'O Lord, give thy Holy Spirit' (*Tallis*) and 'O Redemptor sume carmen' (*Palestrina*) while prayer & anointing continues. When the anointing is concluded, we continue with the Creed. (Prayer in the side chapel may be continuing.)
