Our services in Holy Week and Easter take us through the greatest events in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, and so they are the most important of the church year. On Maundy Thursday evening, after the Eucharist, there is a watch until 11pm and all are welcome to come and go through the evening and to watch a while with Christ. The services on Good Friday all bring us to Jesus' on the Cross. Then the joy of the resurrection bursts forth at Easter. On Easter Eve the new fire is lit, we renew our baptismal vows, bless our new Paschal candle, and celebrate the First Eucharist of Easter. Our Easter celebrations continue on Easter Day itself.
